

From the RCIA Team: As we prepare our 16 catechumens and candidates for their upcoming Rite of Election (March 10th at Holy Rosary Cathedral), we as a team and individually as members of the Body of Christ, have been asked to reflect on the Journey of Faith we are guiding the RCIA class through.

This year we have had quite a change to our RCIA process - we started it (in September 2018) with 8 weeks of the Alpha program which introduced to our participants the 'basics' of our Christian faith in an informal, engaging way that allowed for the growing of a community of people who got to know and build trust in one another through the sharing and exchanging of ideas. Because we saw such fruits, we continued our weekly catechetical sessions in the same 2-part model: presentation followed by small group discussion ~ both parts as vital as the other.

At last Wednesday's RCIA class, following a talk by Fr. Ajin, we asked the group to share some thoughts with us:

"I don't know how to describe the changes in me, but my wife commented that something real must be happening, because I have come to RCIA week to week since September!"

From a Sponsor: *"Growing up in the Catholic Faith from childhood was just a matter of course, it happened naturally. Now seeing the commitment of people going through months of preparation to become Catholic is so inspiring! Many of us were taught our Catholic faith at a young age and much of it is not fully comprehended and just becomes what we do. This experience as an RCIA sponsor has brought some of the fine details of our faith into more clarity."*

"I still have many questions and there is so much more to learn, but I have started praying and talking to God and I have never done that before now..."

A common theme that surfaces in those new in our rich Catholic faith and traditions is: **it is all so much!** And when seen through new eyes of those inexperienced with Catholic ceremony: the music, the prayers, the homily, the movement, the symbols, the ritual - *it is a lot to grasp!* The same will likely be true in the coming weeks when the catechumens experience the majesty of the Cathedral, and as they celebrate the scrutinies and their initiation at the Easter Vigil. It is all *so much*.

Perhaps the "so muchness" of it all is what they will remember...they will remember hearing their name, feeling touched, seeing fire light up the night at the Vigil Mass, hearing so many readings, moving in new spaces, being drenched and oiled, and making life-changing promises.

As we journey with this special group of catechumens, we (the Team and Sponsors) hope that what they will remember most is **love**: the love of God, the love of His family, the love we, the Church, have for Him. They will, no doubt, have difficult days ahead. But a few weeks ago at their Rite of Acceptance, Fr. Dion asked all of us, the baptized, if we were ready to include these men and women in our prayer and affection, and we all shouted our promise: **"We are!"**

As the story opens in today's Gospel reading, Jesus is in need of a platform so he can teach to a crowd pressing in along the shore of Lake Gennesaret. (Gennesaret is also known as the Sea of Galilee and, in tribute to the emperor, the Romans called it Lake Tiberius.) Jesus has become wildly popular having been preaching in the synagogue where he astonished listeners, taught with authority, commanded demons, healed diseases, and the crowds followed him, even seeking him out when he went to deserted places (Luke 4: 31-44).

Fishermen were nearby, washing their nets and Simon's nearby fishing boat makes a handy platform. Jesus gets on Simon's boat and asks him to put out a short distance from the shore. Jesus then sat down in the boat and taught the people. That's the way it was done in those years: student stood and teacher sat; same for sermons in the synagogue.

We can guess that whatever it was Jesus taught from Simon's boat does not seem to have made much difference for Simon - there is no account of Simon's reaction. Maybe he'd heard it all before - there wasn't a Jew in Galilee or Judea who hadn't heard about what God was going to do, someday. Simon, in any case, was unimpressed because, when Jesus tells him to "*put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch*" (Luke 5:4), Simon argues "*Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing...*" But because he knows that Jesus is an authority, follows with "*at your command I will lower the nets*". In other words, he wants to voice the respect for that authority, but at the same time Simon is saying, "I'm not sure I agree with what you're asking of me..."

Are we those fishermen - busy with our lives and unaware of what God intends to do in our lives? What happens when we let Jesus get into the boat of our lives and we let him modify our plans for the day?

This is how the mercy of God works. It waits patiently for an opening, and at the most opportune moment, it seeks to pierce our resistance with a sudden invasion of our privacy. This invasion of Grace is not aggressive, but it is intentional. Jesus did not offer an explanation nor give any details or assurances of His plans. He did not give Simon a heads up, nor did He beg Simon to consider the offer carefully.

God knows that we are, in the words of the prophet Isaiah, men and women of "*unclean lips*", living "*among a people of unclean lips*" (Isaiah 6:5). In the words of the psalmist, God stretches out his hand and with His right

hand delivers us (Psalm 138:7). By the grace of God, we become what we are, and may it always be that His Grace towards us not be in vain (1 Corinthians 15:10) due to our lack of cooperation with it.



This is the key point of today's Gospel: **Jesus did invite himself into Simon's boat, but Simon let him in, did not object, but rather gave Grace the chance to change His life.**

When Jesus gave Simon a new fishing plan, "*Put out into the deep water and let down your nets...*", it must at first have appeared absurd, especially since Jesus was not an accomplished fisherman - he was a carpenter! Not only did the plan appear absurd, we can imagine that Simon was exhausted from having worked all night long. So can we, after years of trying to overcome an addiction, a self-destructive habit, or a lifetime of striving by our own power to "be good". So can we after months or years of not daring to put out into the deep waters of a life with God, content to stay in the shallow waters of a life of just surviving and not *thriving* - the way He intended our lives in Him to be.

"*Yet at your command I will lower the nets*" (Luke 5:5) Simon replies. **Those four words "Yet, at your command" can become our motto of Christian living - our constant reminder not to settle for anything less than the great adventure of having God invite himself into the boat of our lives, and lead us to the deep waters where an abundant miraculous catch of fish awaits us.**

As soon as Simon agrees to put out his boat into the deep water and let down his nets, what happens? Verses 6-7: "*When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking*". **This miraculous catch of fish shows us the profound blessings which will become known to us once we trust God and do what He told us to do.**

And we are not alone... we are all partners into this adventure into the deep waters of God's very intimate life. We will need each other because when one of our brothers or sisters weakens in his/her resolve or has the sinking feeling that this is all too much transformation for his/her sinful self, as Simon Peter said to Jesus "*Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man.*" (v.8), we won't leave him/her alone. We will tell him and her: "You belong in the boat, in the deep waters, with Jesus." "Yet if you say so" Jesus... "Yet if you say so", nothing is impossible with You, even our own transformation from sinner to saint.




