Why did Christ establish one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church? What's God's Goal?

To answer these questions, it can help to ask another question: **What does God love most?**

Because God's existence does not depend on anything outside of himself there can be only one answer. **God's goal is God.** God loves God most. Does this make God an egocentric narcissist who is ultimately incapable of love? Not at all. God is not "self-centered" in human terms; God is God-centered in God terms, and "God is love" (1 John 4:8). God's very being is an eternal exchange of love—Father loving Son, Son loving Father, in the binding love of the Holy Spirit.

God's ultimate goal is to glorify God and to enjoy God forever. To borrow from Ignatius of Loyola, everything God does is "for the greater glory of God." The Persons of the most adorable Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—are eternally and passionately in love with one another. God's love for us is grounded in God's love for himself, and this makes his love for us so divine. What is the best gift God can give you? **Ultimately, the best gift God can give you is himself.** "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (John 3:16). We were made for God.

When it comes to the Catholic Church, our first impulse can be to want God to make a big deal out of us. **But the Church is not about us. It's about God.** He established the Church "like a garden, a field [God] sows." St. Paul says "You are God's field" (1 Cor. 3:9). As the baptized faithful, then, we were made for growing something beautiful, for bringing God praise.

Jesus ascended into the heavens and left his Catholic Church to finish the mission because he is bringing glory to his Father in Heaven—and he wants us, empowered with the Holy Spirit, to join him.

Message for Lent 2014 #lent

This Sunday's Mass Readings

1ST READING: Joshua 5:9-12
RESPONSORIAL: Psalm 34: 2-7
2ND READING: 2 Cor 5: 17-21
GOSEL: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

Pope Francis' Angelus address on Sunday, March 6, 2016 at noon to the faithful in St. Peter's Square w2.vatican.va

In Chapter 15 of Luke's Gospel, we find three parables of mercy: that of the sheep (vv. 4-7), that of the coin found (vv. 8-10), and the great parable of the prodigal son, or rather the parable of the merciful father (vv. 11-32). The story makes us understand some features of this **father as a man always ready to forgive and to hope against hope**. It affects primarily his tolerance before the younger son's decision to leave home: he could resist, knowing that he is still immature, a young boy, or seek some lawyer to not give him his inheritance, still being alive. Instead, he allows him to leave, having predicted some possible risks. **God works with us like this: He lets us be free, even to make mistakes**, because in creating us, He has given us the great gift of freedom. It is for us to put it to good use. This gift of freedom that God gives us always amazes me!

But the separation from his son is only physical; for his father always carries him in his heart; confidently, he awaits his return; he scans the road in the hope of seeing him. And one day he sees him appear in the distance (v. 20). But this means that this father, every day, went up to the terrace to watch if his son came back! Then he is moved to see it, runs towards him, embraces him, kisses him. How much tenderness! And this son had made them big! But the father welcomes him like this.

The same attitude the father reserves also to the eldest son, who has always remained at home, and now he is indignant and protesting because he does not understand and does not share all that kindness towards his brother who was wrong. The father also goes out to meet this son and reminds him that they have always been together, they have everything in common (v. 31), but we must welcome with joy the brother who finally returned home. And this makes me think of one thing: when one feels a sinner, one really feels very little, or I have heard many say: "*Father, I am a filth!*" Then it is time to go to the Father. On the other hand, when one feels righteous: "*I have always done things well...*", **equally the Father comes to look for us, because that attitude of feeling right is wrong: it is pride!** It comes from the devil. The Father awaits those who recognize



themselves as sinners and goes in search of those who feel righteous. This is our Father!

A third child can also be seen in this parable. A third child? And where? It's hidden! It is what "*he did not consider a privilege to be like [the Father], but he emptied himself, assuming a condition of servant*" (Phil 2 : 6-7). This Son-Servant is Jesus! It is the extension of the arms and heart of the Father: He welcomed the prodigal and washed his dirty feet; He prepared the feast for the feast of forgiveness. He, Jesus, teaches us to be "merciful like the Father".

The figure of the father of the parable reveals the heart of God. **He is the merciful Father who in Jesus loves us beyond measure, always awaits our conversion whenever we make mistakes; it awaits our return when we move away from Him thinking we can do without it; he is always ready to open his arms to whatever has happened.**

Like the father of the Gospel, God continues to consider us his children when we are lost, and he comes to us with tenderness when we return to him. And he speaks to us with so much kindness when we believe we are righteous, pleading with us to come in and join the celebration. The mistakes we make, even if large, do not detract from the fidelity of his love.

In the sacrament of Reconciliation we can always start again: He welcomes us, gives us back the dignity of his children and tells us: "Go ahead! Be at peace! Get up, go ahead!"

In this stretch of Lent that still separates us from Easter, we are called to intensify the inner journey of conversion. **Let us allow ourselves to be reached by the loving look of our Father, and return to him with all our heart, rejecting any compromise with sin.**


