Our Lady, Star of the Sea, Pray for us! Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel is a good example that Jesus' disciples were remarkably slow to grasp the significance of his life and teaching. The two brothers, John and James, come to Jesus with an important request: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." A pretty bold request!

The misunderstanding was in those two words: "your glory". Jesus' glory would be radically different from anything those two friends of his expected. No wonder Jesus responded: "You do not know what you are asking." At once he challenged them with the counter-question: "Can you drink the cup I shall drink or be baptized in the same baptism?"

Lightheartedly Jesus' two friends replied: "We are able". Clearly they had still not understood what lay ahead for the Master whom they so loved and revered. The 'cup' Jesus referred to would be a cup of bitter suffering. His 'baptism' would not be in water but in blood. If his friends had really understood that, they might not have been so eager to share in his 'glory', as they so lightly called it.

Today, Jesus shows us once again, what true authority looks like: true authority comes to those who serve others and meet the needs of their fellow human beings. Jesus' whole life was one of service. Being NUMBER ONE in the Christian community means being at the service of others. Service can easily be misused to lord it over others. In fact, there is nothing more devious than those who serve others in order to service their own ego. *May God bless us and grant us the grace to serve and love like Jesus, our Saviour. Amen*!

You may have noticed that we have been trying to grow our ushering ministry. First of all, I would like to thank all those who have come forward with a heart to serve — Thank you for stepping forward, we appreciate your sacrifice! We are still in need of ushers at the 5pm and 7pm Masses. One of the important steps our ushers will be making is this: they will be instructing <u>latecomers to Mass to remain outside the nave until an appropriate time to be seated</u>. Many people are arriving late to Mass, disrupting the Liturgy of the Word. So, <u>if you are late, arriving in the middle of the proclamation of word of God, you will be asked to wait</u>.

I also ask that those who do arrive on time to Mass to please move towards the front pews, allowing the very back pews for those arriving later. I know people have their favourite pew and many are very attached to 'their' pew...but in the spirit of today's Gospel, let us love others in this way: by giving up our own comforts for the good of the other.

And, a final reminder to parents with children—grades 4 and up who are baptized and have received the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist: <u>Altar Server</u> <u>Training starts this coming week</u>! The Gospel of today's Liturgy narrates that two disciples, James and John, ask the Lord to one day sit beside him in glory, as if they were "prime ministers", or something like that. But the other disciples hear it and become indignant. At that point, Jesus patiently offers them a great teaching. It is this: true glory is not obtained by rising over others, but by experiencing the same baptism that He, Jesus, would receive just a little later in Jerusalem, that

is, the cross. What does this mean? The word "baptism" means "immersion": through his Passion, Jesus immersed himself into death, offering his life to save us. Therefore, his glory, the glory of God, is love that becomes **service**—Not power that seeks to dominate, no! But love that becomes service. Thus, Jesus ends saying to his disciples and to us as well: "Whoever would be great among you must be your servant" (Mark 10: 43). To become great, you should take the service, serving others.

We are in front of two different types of logic: the disciples want to rise up and Jesus wants to immerse Himself. Let us spend a few moments on these two verbs:

The first is to *rise up*. It expresses that worldly mentality to which we are always tempted: to experience everything, including relationships, in order to feed our ambition, to climb the ladder of success, to reach important positions. The quest for personal prestige can become a spiritual malady, masquerading itself even behind good intentions: for example, when behind the good we do and preach, we actually seek ourselves alone and our own affirmation, that is, that we get ahead and climb upwe see it in the Church! How many times, we Christians – who should be servants – try to climb up, to get ahead. We therefore always need to evaluate our heart's real intentions, to ask ourselves: "Why am I carrying out this work, this responsibility? To offer service or rather to be recognised, praised and to receive compliments?"

Jesus contrasts this worldly logic with his own: instead of exalting yourself over others, get off your pedestal to serve them; instead of rising above others, to be immersed in others' lives. There are so, so many in need...seek to be immersed in service rather than to climb up for one's own glory!

Here is the second verb: **to be immersed**. Jesus asks us to immerse ourselves. And how should we immerse ourselves? Compassionately in the lives of those we meet. Do we think compassionately about the hunger of so many people? When we have a meal before us, which is a grace from God that we can eat, there are people who do not have enough food for the entire month. Not just hunger for food, but hunger for friendship, communion. Do we take the time to compassionately hear others' needs? Lend a sympathetic ear, a shoulder to cry on, prayers offered.

Do I have compassion for people? **Compassion for** the lives of those we meet, like Jesus has done with me, with you, with all of us, he drew near with compassion.

> Let us look at the Crucified Lord, completely immersed in our wounded history, and we will discover God's way of doing things. We see that he did not remain up above in heaven to look down on us from up there, but he lowered himself to wash our feet. God is love and love is humble, it does not exalt itself, but comes down

like the rain that falls to the earth and brings life. But how can we adopt the same direction as Jesus, going from raising ourselves up to immersing ourselves, from the mentality of prestige to that of service? Dedication is needed, but that is not enough. It is difficult alone, but not impossible, for we have a strength within that helps us. It is the strength of Baptism, of that immersion in Jesus that all of us have already received through grace that directs us, moving us to follow him instead of seeking our interests, but to put ourselves at the service of others. It is a grace, a fire that the Spirit has kindled in us that needs to be nurtured.

Today, let us ask the Holy Spirit to renew the grace of Baptism in us, that immersion in Jesus, in his way of being, to be more like servants, to be servants like he has been with us.

And let us pray to the Madonna: she – even though she was the greatest – did not seek to rise up, but was the humble servant of the Lord, and is completely immersed in our service to help us encounter Jesus.
