

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus' question to the future disciples is a fundamental one which we must all ponder: "What are you looking for?" These men had been told by John that Jesus was the Lamb of God. They instinctively followed him. These men no doubt were looking for many things: a better way to fish, perhaps the one who would drive the Romans out; maybe nothing greater than a few words of kindness and some direction their lives. Yet one gets the impression that there was something deeper at work. These pragmatic fishermen were looking for that which lasts. In the midst of flux and constant change, they dimly perceived in Jesus that he was the One who is the Way, Truth and Life and light. They saw through the eyes of faith, that in Jesus their deepest longings and hopes would be realized. They sensed in this unknown teaching a message that would only grow in power with the passage of time. The impulse was great: these men had to go where lesus was staying.

The invitation of Jesus is straightforward and open-ended: "Come and see" Jesus does not specify what is to follow. But neither does he fool them with false promises and grand plans. What is crucial is the willingness to follow the person of Jesus. To be a disciple is to be where Jesus is. We must let go of our personal agenda and be willing to listen. Follow and see where Jesus is to be found. We cannot drag along all our conditions and expectations. To follow lesus and see where he is, is to be part of the great adventure of faith. One thing is for sure, it is never dull.

What are you looking for? What do you want out of life? For sure, every one of us desires to be happy. But many things promise contentment, pleasure, happiness...Only Jesus is the way to true and lasting happiness and peace. We are called to live in such a way that others will want to come and see where Jesus stays. There is a great dignity in our Christian vocation. We belong to Jesus, having become part of God's family through his death and resurrection.

Part of the modern attitude today is to play it cool and not commit too much, too soon; always keep your options open. Above all, hold a little back so you won't be dependent on anyone. It's not that we are not listening or close to God's call, it's just that we want to know the job description and what will be required of us. But today, we are reminded that the invitation to follow Jesus, the Lamb of God, is extended to each of us. Let us develop a listening heart and willing spirit, so that when the Lord speaks to us we will be ready and willing to respond totally.

Starting this weekend, we will be praying our Centenary Prayer at all Masses celebrated in our parish. I





All Catholics should be able to do this at some level, and your Parish library can help you prepare for these discussions. General books about apologetics are in section 239, and you can find other resources on specific topics throughout the library and on **FORMED**.

Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence. 1 Peter 3: 15

We have many options for learning how to respond to common questions about and arguments against the Church. **Essential Catholic Survival Guide: Answers to Tough Questions about the Faith** (239 Cat 2005) answers questions about Catholicism to help you navigate any conversation about your Faith.

Why We're Catholic: Our Reasons for Faith, Hope, and

Love (239 Hor 2017) will help you explain why we believe in anything at all and to answer common objections to the



Catholic Faith—both doctrinal and moral.

The New Apologetics:
Defending the Faith in a Post-Christian Era (239 Nel 2022)

God; the dignity of man; pain,
suffering, and evil; eternal life and

the meaning of salvation; hope; the relationship of Christianity to other faiths and that of Catholicism to other branches of the Christian faith. C.S. Lewis is another author that even the non-religious will know.

His **Mere Christianity** (230 Lew 1952) makes Christian belief accessible and finds a common ground on which all those who have Christian faith can stand together.

Catholic Controversies: Understanding Church Teachings and Events in

History (270 Gab 2010) corrects common misunderstandings and myths perpetuated by the media, professors and the uninformed.

Reclaiming Vatican II: What It (Really) Said, What It Means, and How It Calls Us to Renew the Church (262.5 Bri 2021) clears up misconceptions about the council and reveals how—when properly understood and applied—it fosters a richer experience of being in the Church.


